

## June 2009: Focus on Mongolia & Solomon Islands

### Mongolia

Preaching work began in Mongolia in 1995. It has been confined to the capital Ulaanbaatar where almost half of the population of 2.3 million live. Newspaper advertising is permitted and advertised seminars have been conducted over the recent years. There are three brothers and one sister in the ecclesia in Ulaanbaatar. The ACBM rents a flat in the city as a home for the ecclesia and to provide accommodation for mission visits.

Mongolia is a land locked nation squeezed between Siberia and China. The Winter climate is harsh with the maximum daytime temperature hovering around -20 C and is unsuitable for mission visits.

Our brothers and sister are very isolated from the wider Christadelphian world and would welcome both your prayers and visits.

### Solomon Islands

The work started in 1996 with the first baptism in 1998. In very recent times there have been five baptisms which brings the total number of brethren and sisters in Solomon Islands to 15; five in Malaita, eight in Honiara and one on Reef Islands, which is the most southerly part of the country.

The small groups gather together at times for Brethren's Conferences or Bible Schools to strengthen the work and their faith.

Seminars are conducted in conjunction with fieldworker visits. There are some 80 contacts undertaking the Bible Correspondence Course.

The "Let the Bible Speak" program broadcast on national radio on Sunday evenings, is well known and has a large audience throughout the country.
